## Lemonade Stand Designs

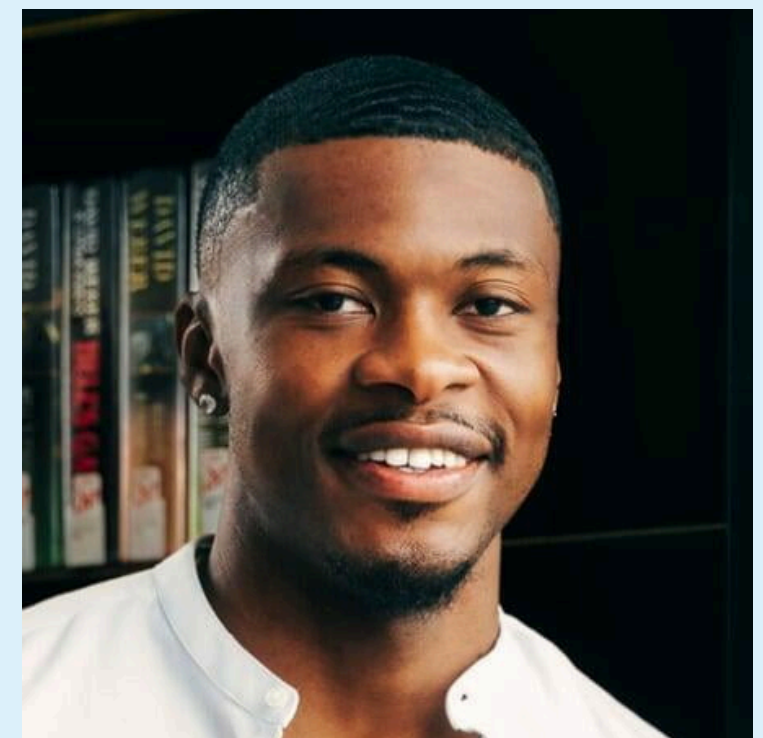
